CareerEdge Assists Trade Students with Grant from COVID-19 Response Initiative



This Spring, CareerEdge helped trade students get hands-on experience with new support from a \$20,000 grant from the COVID-19 Response Initiative, Charles & Margery Barancik Foundation, Gulf Coast Community Foundation, and Truist Foundation.

The funding bolstered CareerEdge's work with HVAC and manufacturing employer partners to place full-time Suncoast Technical College trades students, who were only months away from graduation, in paid internships when schools went online in March. The internship program fills trades employers' immediate need for workers and provided an opportunity for students to

receive an hourly wage, gain hands-on skills and course credit, and sets them up to secure a job after graduation.

15 interns were placed with local HVAC and manufacturing employers. Most of the internships finish in a few weeks, and of those that have completed their internships, 71% of the students have been hired.

HVAC Installation & Maintenance Fast-Track Training Graduation

On Tuesday, June 30th CareerEdge hosted an HVAC Installation & Maintenance Fast-Track Training Graduation. Six program participants graduated with their EPA certification, HVAC maintenance, preventative maintenance, forklift, job site safety and equipment repairs skills as well as Bridges to Careers Soft Skills training.

The HVAC Fast-Track Training is a way for



employers to quickly fill in demand HVAC openings that offer a career pathway for future promotions within the industry. CareerEdge brought HVAC employers and Suncoast Technical College (STC) together to identify the specific curriculum components for this consolidated, employer led hands on training.

In March, the instructor quickly adapted the curriculum when STC transitioned to online learning by developing presentations and tests, using Zoom to connect with participants for an hour three times per week through late May. Working closely with HVAC employers, CareerEdge placed 100% of the students in employment making an average wage of \$14.00 per hour.

What's Ahead

- Throughout the summer, CareerEdge convened its <u>Manufacturing, HVAC</u>, <u>Automotive and Insurance Councils</u> which include employers and education providers.
